

2018/19

For the 2018/19 financial year the school allocation of Pupil Premium funding was £89,020; an £8,500 decrease from 2017/18 due to the school having slightly fewer children eligible for Pupil Premium funding. The funding has and will continue to support 'Vulnerable / Pupil Premium' pupils to achieve the very best they can. The funding has been spent in the following ways:

- £33,978 – Teacher employed 3.5 days a week throughout the 2018/19 academic year to teach targeted, personalised Literacy and Maths intervention programmes to accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium pupils in Years 1 – 6.
- £6,500 – Maths tutor employed 0.5 days per week throughout the academic year to lead a personalised teaching programme to accelerate the progress of 'Pupil Premium' pupils in Years 5/6 in mathematics.
- £19,000 – Targeted interventions run by teaching assistants and teachers to support and accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium pupils.
- £12,600 – To allow Pupil Premium pupils to attend extra-curricular clubs; breakfast and after school clubs, holiday clubs, go on school visits, have music tuition and be taken to the theatre.
- £1,500 – Targeted support from a 'home school worker' for 'Vulnerable / Pupil Premium' pupils and families.
- £5,000 – 'Booster Revision' and 'Study Support' classes run prior to school, at lunchtime and after school for targeted 'Pupil Premium / Vulnerable' pupils in Y5/6 in Reading, Writing, SPAG and Mathematics, to support them with their learning and accelerate progress.
- £2,200 – Targeted Speech and Language therapy support for 'Vulnerable / Pupil Premium' pupils.
- £3,500 – Extra teaching assistant support in EYFS to give social, emotional and behaviour support to Premium Pupils.
- £4,742 for learning resources to engage and facilitate pupil progress e.g. iPads new apps, new reading books, playground equipment and SENS resources
