

2019/20

For the 2019/20 financial year, the school allocation of Pupil Premium funding was £79,200; a £9,820 decrease from 2018/19 due to the school having slightly fewer children eligible for Pupil Premium funding. The funding has and will continue to support 'Vulnerable/Pupil Premium' pupils to achieve the very best they can. The funding has been spent in the following ways:

- £29,000 – Teacher employed 2.5 days a week throughout the 2019/20 academic year to teach targeted, personalised English and Maths intervention programmes to accelerate the progress of pupils In Year 1-6.
- £6,500 – Maths tutor employed 0.5 days per week throughout the academic year to lead a personalised teaching programme to accelerate the progress of 'Pupil Premium' children in Years 5/6 in Mathematics.
- £1,500 – Targeted support from a counsellor for Pupil Premium/Vulnerable children and their families.
- £5,000 – Personalised ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) support for Vulnerable/Pupil Premium pupils as well as resources.
- £15,000 – Targeted interventions run by teaching assistants and teachers to support and accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium pupils including Reading Comprehension, Writing, Mathematics, Nesy and Lego therapy.
- £5,000 – 'Booster Revision' and 'Study Support' classes run prior to school, at lunchtime and after school for targeted 'Pupil Premium/Vulnerable' pupils in Y5/6 in Reading, Writing, SPaG and Mathematics to support them with their learning and accelerate progress.
- £1,800 – Extra teaching assistant support in EYFS to give social, emotional and behaviour support to Pupil Premium pupils.
- £2,500 – Targeted Speech and Language therapy support for 'Vulnerable/Pupil Premium' pupils.
- £10,500 – To allow Pupil Premium/Vulnerable pupils to attend extra-curricular clubs; breakfast and after school clubs, holiday clubs, school visits, residential trips, have music tuition and be taken to the theatre.
- £2,400 – for learning resources to engage and facilitate pupil progress e.g. apps, new reading books, SENs resources and equipment.
