

2020/21

For the 2020/21 financial year, the school allocation of Pupil Premium funding is £82,045; an increase of £2,845 from 2019/20 due to the school having more children eligible for Pupil Premium funding. The funding has and will continue to support 'Vulnerable/Pupil Premium' pupils to achieve the very best they can. The funding has been spent in the following ways:

Additional teacher (2.5 days a week)	£33,485	To provide targeted, personalised English and Maths intervention programmes to accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium children in Years 1 – 6.	Quality first teaching ensured that at least expected progress was made for many pupil premium children.
Targeted interventions by teaching assistants and teachers	£16,500	To support and accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium children for Reading Comprehension, Writing, Maths, Nessy and Lego Therapy.	Interventions successfully carried out. Pupil progress data reflects the success of these.
Targeted support from a counsellor for Pupil Premium/Vulnerable children and their families.	£3,000	To support the emotional wellbeing of our pupils. Increased need following the impact of COVID-19. Targeted Speech and Language therapy support	£2,500	To develop Pupil Premium/Vulnerable children's speech and language skills.	Personalised speech and language interventions were provided to the necessary pupils ensuring that they received targeted support.
Access to clubs and activities	£10,500	To enable Pupil Premium children/Vulnerable pupils to attend extra-curricular clubs; breakfast and after school clubs, holiday clubs, school visits, residential trips, have music tuition, PE kits and school uniform.	Due to COVID-19 limitations, a number of trips and clubs were cancelled or postponed. Those that did take place provided pupils with a broadened curriculum experience.

Booster Revision/Study Support Classes for Y5/6	£6,000	To support Pupil Premium children/Vulnerable pupils prior to school, at lunchtime and after school for targeted support in Reading, Writing, SPaG and Mathematics to support them with their learning and accelerate progress.	Children were ready for next stage of their education at secondary school.
Additional teaching assistant support in EYFS/KS1	£3,000	To provide social, emotional and behavior support to Pupil Premium pupils.	Interventions and rapid catch up sessions were provided to our most vulnerable pupils, including during lockdown where additional phone and online support was put in place. This ensured that early gaps in learning were identified and acted upon to narrow the gap.
Additional learning resources	£1,700	To engage and facilitate pupil progress.	Resources were available to support teaching and learning of pupil premium pupils.
