Learn to manipulate language and be able to substitute words for suitable alternatives.	Write a piece of text using language from a variety of units covered and learn to adapt any models provided to show solid understanding of the grammar covered. Start to incorporate conjugated verbs and develop confidence in using conjunctions, adjectives and possessive adjectives.

EG. a, some, the. Start to understand simple adjectival agreement, the negative form and possessive adjectives.	To use and recognise the terminology of articles. Further develop their understanding of the rules of adjectival agreement and possessive adjectives. Start to explore full verb conjugation.	Consolidate understanding of gender and nouns, use of the negative and possessive adjectives. Become more familiar with using a wider range of conjunctions. Further develop confidence in full verb conjugation, both regular and irregular.
